In the context of the 26th Biennale INTERIEUR 2018, Biennale Interieur and its curatorial team launch 'The Floor Is Yours': an open call which will allocate floor space to inspiring installations by young talent and new designer-driven labels.

This platform will be housed within the Rambla of the Kortrijk Xpo venue.

The 'Application for participation' is valid only when completed online on www.interieur.be.

3

'The Floor Is Yours' has a limited number of spaces available. Entering an 'Application for participation' does not mean automatic selection to participate. A selection committee convened by the Biennale Interieur will decide who will be allowed to take part, mainly on the basis of the documentation provided alongside the 'Application for participation'. The members of the committee will remain anonymous, and their decisions are final.

Selected participants must pay the stand rental fee within 30 days (invoice date) on the account of the Biennale Interieur: 285-0221180-49, BNP Paribas Fortis, Waterpoort 1, B – 8500 Kortrijk, IBAN BE97 2850 2211 8049, BIC GEBABEBB. All invoices need to be paid at latest Sept 1st if invoice date is later than August 15th. A stand can only be allocated after receipt of the fee before the deadline. Should a participant decide not to take part after payment of the fee, it cannot be refunded and will be regarded as compensation.

Manufacturers, retailers or distributors may not participate. However, participants may show products that have been taken into production. Participants may obtain sponsorship from companies whose products are displayed on the stand. In such cases, the visual presence of manufacturers or sponsors should remain limited to simple mention of their name on the stand,

and brochures which include only the selected products. Before the start of 'The Floor Is Yours', the committee will publish detailed instructions in order to guarantee as much uniformity as possible, and will be the sole authority as to what will be allowed. Participants must remove any advertising material that does not conform to the rules without delay.

The Biennale Interieur undertakes to make available to each exhibitor the stand space, including the necessary universal lighting. A detailed architectural plan of positions will be sent to participants before September 1st 2018 at the latest.

To ensure as much variation and balance as possible, the Biennale Interieur will decide the exact stand to be allocated to participants.

Work on dressing the stand can start three days before the opening of INTERIEUR 2018. All stands must be finished the day before the opening, before 5 pm. Breakdown may not start before the Biennale is closed, and may take place one calendar day after the exhibition. Remaining packaging and other materials will be removed by the Biennale Interieur if necessary, removal costs to be charged to the exhibitor. Each participant is responsible for transport plus cost of all items on display and other material, before build-up and after breakdown.

The venue will be equipped with under-floor cabling for electricity, onto which participants can connect their own installations. Participants must advise the Biennale Interieur about each connection to this network before September 1st 2018, including a detailed description of power requirements.

Signage at 'The Floor Is Yours' will be installed exclusively by the Biennale Interieur, to ensure conformity.

Each participant is responsible for the permanent manning of his/her stand. 'The Floor Is Yours' will be open from 18 to 22 October, every day between 10 am and 8 pm. On Wednesday 17 October, there will be a pre-opening and therefore also 'The Floor Is Yours' will be open from 6 pm onwards.

Participants are expected to insure their goods and materials against all possible risks. In no way can the Biennale Interieur be held responsible for any damage to persons or goods, be it the result of accident, rain, theft or fire, or any other cause. Participants and their personnel are responsible for any accidents or damage to the building, their own goods, or other participants and visitors, and their goods.

13. Each participant is entitled to a free mention in the 'The Floor Is Yours' section of the INTERIEUR 2018 catalogue, which will be published by the Biennale Interieur.

In signing the 'Application for participation' form, each candidate undertakes to adhere to all clauses of these regulations, and to adhere to all measures and instructions to be issued by the Foundation's committee at a later date. All participants are also expected to conform to all other legal requirements and regulations, regarding taxation, copyright, permits, etc.

Participants undertake not to disturb the general atmosphere of 'The Floor Is Yours' with music, projection or any other form of expression which would extend beyond the boundaries of their own stand.

16

Should there be an infringement upon the regulations by any participant, the Biennale Interieur is entitled to put an end to it without delay. This may also involve immediate vacation of the stand, any costs to be charged to the participant involved. The Biennale Interieur reserves the right to remove persons, products or materials from the stands, should these not conform to the regulations.

17

Exceptions to all the above can only be allowed after permission in writing from the Biennale Interieur.

18

Should the Biennale Interieur decide that INTERIEUR 2018 cannot take place, because of economic condition, circumstances beyond their control or for any other reason, participants will not be entitled to any compensation.

In case of dispute, the Court of Kortrijk will be the sole arbitrator, and only the Dutch text of the regulations is legally valid.
